Sozi Tulante joins Penn Law after working as an Assistant U.S. Attorney in the Eastern District of PA.

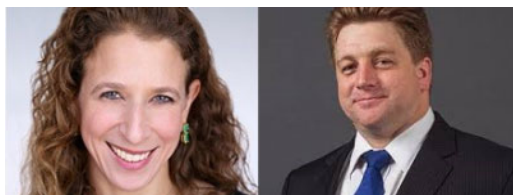
