



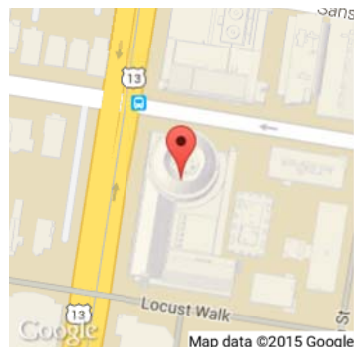

Climate Change Policy and the Upcoming Paris COP21 Talks: Risk Regulation Seminar

What is required to achieve climate change policies that will reduce the weather-related risks associated with global warming? Lead authors from the newly released Fifth Assessment Report (AR5) of the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) – the most comprehensive assessment of climate change yet undertaken – will highlight key findings from the report that would be useful to consider in the upcoming Paris COP21 talks. The IPCC Fifth Assessment Report provides an up-to-date view of the scientific understanding of climate change and risk perception, and the impact these have on different levels of decision-making and policy options.

This seminar will bring together several of the nation's leading experts on climate change policy and will be of interest to anyone interested in the future of international efforts to address this global environmental problem.
