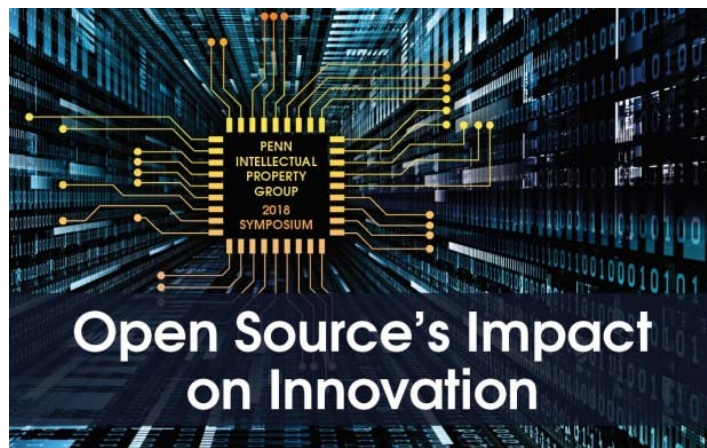

KEYNOTE SPEAKER BIO

Mr. Keith Bergelt is currently the chief executive officer of the Open Innovation Network, a pro-competitive patent aggregation community protecting the open innovation of the widely-used Linux software against aggressive patent "trolls." Before his time as CEO of the Open Innovation Network, Mr. Bergelt led two hedge funds, Paradox Capital and IP, both of which were formed to emphasize and assert the value of various intellectual property domains in mid-market companies. He also spent several years at the Motorola Corporation, serving as the company's General Manager of the Strategic Intellectual Asset Management business unit and additionally as Director of Technology Strategy.
