Following 9/11, the New York Police Department established a sprawling and secretive human mapping and suspicionless surveillance program that targeted Muslim American communities in New York, New Jersey, and beyond. *Hassan v. City of New York*, a federal lawsuit filed against the City of New York that challenges the New York Police Department's tactics, is the first case ever brought on behalf of Muslim Americans who were unlawfully targeted and surveilled under this program.
