Gary Francione is the Distinguished Professor of Law and Nicholas deB. Katzenbach Scholar of Law & Philosophy at Rutgers School of Law–Newark. Francione is the author or co-author of several books about animal rights, including *The Animal Rights Debate: Abolition or Regulation?* (2010, with Robert Garner), *Animals as Persons* (2008), *Rain Without Thunder: The Ideology of the Animal Rights Movement* (1996), and *Animals, Property, and the Law* (1995).

David DeGrazia is a Professor at George Washington University in the Philosophy Department. He specializes in bioethics and animal ethics and is the author of many books, including *Biomedical Ethics*, 7th ed., coedited with Thomas Mappes and Jeffrey Brand-Ballard (New York: McGraw-Hill, 2011); 6th ed., 2006; 5th ed., 2001; 4th ed., 1996 and *Taking Animals Seriously: Mental Life and Moral Status* (Cambridge: Cambridge University Press, 1996).
