President Donald Trump has made regulatory reform a priority, asserting that his Administration will achieve a substantial reduction in legal burdens without significantly compromising public protections. To date, President Trump has signed legislation rescinding several rules adopted by the Obama Administration, issued executive orders calling for agencies to review and possibly rescind other regulations, and signed executive orders calling for agencies to repeal still more existing rules before adopting new ones. In addition, his Administration has established a hiring freeze across the federal government, proposed significant budget cuts for regulatory agencies, and appointed agency officials sympathetic to his

regulatory reform vision. Future actions may involve the adoption of legislation changing substantive regulatory statutes, such as in the areas of finance and health care, as well as legislation changing the procedural steps agencies must follow to adopt new regulations.
