The Battle over Kenya's Democracy: A Flawed Election, A Rerun, and the Supreme Court

In a triumphant moment for democracy, the Kenyan Supreme Court nullified the presidential election of August, 2017. However, just when Kenyans hopes of a strong and independent Supreme Court were on the rise, only one of the six Justices turned up to hear a petition on the rerun, ending a battle over Kenya's democratic institutions and plunging the country once again into post- election chaos and violence.

Maina Kiai, the leading Kenyan human rights lawyer, will discuss the rights to peaceful assembly and association in the United States and Kenya post- elections. Maina Kiai served as United Nations Special Rapporteur on the Rights to Freedom of Peaceful Assembly and Association (2011–2017).
