Police Disciplinary Appeals: A Law Review Author Lunch with Prof. Stephen Rushin

Join *Law Review* for a conversation with Professor Stephen Rushin about his research and work on his article in Volume 167, *Police Disciplinary Appeals*.

Professor Rushin, in this article, comprehensively examines the appeals process available to officers facing disciplinary sanctions. After reviewing the different appellate procedures offered to police officers, he argues that although each of the procedures are individually defensible, they combine in a large number of police departments to create a formidable barrier to democratic police accountability. Professor Rushin also offers additional substantive steps that municipalities could take to ensure officers have adequate procedural protections from arbitrary punishment, while recognizing the important community interest in police accountability.
