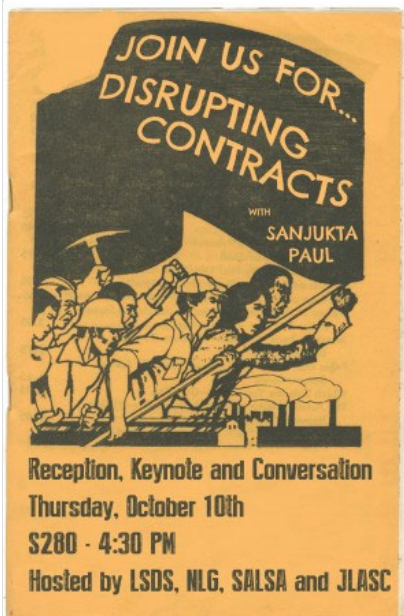

Why do 1L doctrinal courses ignore questions of political economy, race, and social struggle? How do history, power, and ideology shape legal institutions and practices? And how can the law be used to advance justice? The Disrupting Doctrine speaker series will encourage students to seriously grapple with these questions by showcasing critical perspectives on core doctrinal courses, starting with "Disrupting Contracts with Sanjukta Paul" on October 10th at 4:30 PM.
