

The faculty and students of the Law School record their deep sense of loss in the death of Stevens Hecksher, Esq., Associate in Law, on May 8, 1931. Mr. Hecksher was graduated from the University of Pennsylvania with the degree of A. B. in 1896 and from the Law School of Harvard University with the degree of LL. B. in 1899 since which time he was engaged in the active practice of law in Philadelphia. On July 1, 1929, he was appointed an Associate in Law and for two years ably conducted the course on Legal Ethics given to the third-year class. His untimely death in the prime of life is a severe loss not only to the Law School and the Philadelphia Bar but to the community at large, to which he rendered such outstanding services, especially in legal and philanthropic activities. His personality and character made him an outstanding citizen.
