In a recent decision by the Texas Supreme Court, Justice Don Willett struck down state licensing requirements for eyebrow threaders. By adopting a stricter standard of review for potentially oppressive government regulations, the Court's decision in *Patel v. TX Department Licensing & Regulation* rejects the perceived threat of *Lochner* and seeks to prevent the state from arbitrarily interfering with an individual's right to work. Arguably, *Patel* and other state court decisions are setting the foundation for a revival of economic liberty as an essential constitutional right.
