Please join us for Ambassador Mejia's remarks on the ongoing Colombian Peace Process, as seen through the role played by the United Nations and the recently created mandate for a Special Political Mission.

Maria Emma Mejia Velez is the Permanent Representative of Colombia to the United Nations and current Chair of the Third Committee of the UG General Assembly which is responsible for handling various issues including social, humanitarian affairs and human rights issues that affect people all over the world.

Before representing her Country before the U.N., she served as Secretary-General of the Union of South American Nations (UNASUR) and occupied several distinguished Government offices in the Colombian Government, including Minister for Foreign Affairs, Minister for Education, and Ambassador to Spain. She is a journalist and diplomat with broad experience in international affairs. Likewise, she has devoted much of her career to the issues of peace and relations between the Latin American countries.

Ambassador Mejia played a vital role in achieving the peace agreement between the Colombian government and the FARC guerrilla to end more than 50 years of conflict.

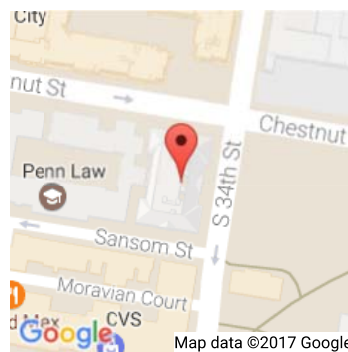
